


### **COME JOIN THE FUN! EVERYONE IS WELCOME!**

Knowing who is supposed to be at school will allow school office staff to best ensure all students are accounted for. Students are asked to



ensure they report to their first period class for attendance.

#### Select:

- Bus cancellation as the reason for absence if your student
- Inclement weather as the reason for the absence if your student walks but chooses not to attend.
